Professor Dr Clemens Ladenburger LL.M. studied law at the universities of Freiburg, Geneva and Chicago. He earned his doctor iur. from the University of Heidelberg in 1999. He was Rechtsreferendar from 1993 to 1995; an academic assistant at the University of Heidelberg from 1996 to 1998; an official of the German Federal Ministry of Justice from 1998 on and a temporary agent in the SG of the Council of the EU from 1998 to 1999.

In 1999 he joined the European Commission's Legal Service. In 2000 he participated in the Convention which drafted the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights.

Between 2002 and 2003 he was seconded to the secretariat of the European Convention that drew up the Treaty establishing a Constitution for Europe.

From 2003 - 2007, he was a member of the Team "Institutions" of the Commission's Legal Service.

From 2008 to 2017, he was an assistant to the Director-General of the Legal Service, tasked with overall legal coordination. In 2012 he was appointed Legal Adviser. His focus of work was on economic governance, migration and the refugee crisis, Brexit issues, as well as internal security and fight against terrorism and crime. In 2013/2014, he acted as Secretary to a High Level Expert Group on "Debt Redemption Fund and Eurobills".

After an assignment as Brexit coordinator in 2017, he has been appointed as Principal Legal Advisor and Director for Justice and Home Affairs in the European Commission's Legal Service in November 2017. He leads a team of lawyers advising the Commission and representing it in the European Court of Justice, in the areas of asylum and migration, borders (Schengen), EU citizenship, internal security, criminal law as well as judicial cooperation in civil matters.

Clemens Ladenburger has lectured and published widely on fundamental rights, justice and home affairs, economic and monetary union, Brexit, and various other topics of EU constitutional and administrative law. He teaches as Honorary Professor at the Europa Institute of the Saarland University and is a member of the European Group of of Public Law.
