Dr. Eda Gemi is a political sociologist specializing in the governance of international migration and integration policies in Southeast Europe and the Western Balkans. She is Associate Professor and Head of the Law Department at the University of New York Tirana, and Research Associate at the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP), where she previously led the Migration Research Unit (2012-2016).

From 2010 to 2022, she was a Senior Researcher at the Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies at the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence, Italy, and JESH (Joint Excellence in Science and Humanities) Fellow at the Austrian Academy of Sciences in Vienna (2018-2019).

Dr. Gemi serves as a migration expert for the OECD Network of International Migration Experts (SOPEMI), contributing to the preparation of the annual report of International Migration Outlook, and as SOC Panel Vice-Chair for MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships (REA). Since 2018, she has been a Steering Committee member of Euro-Mediterranean Research Network on Migration (EuroMedMig).

Her recent publications include the books "Rethinking Migration and Return in Southeastern Europe: Albanian Mobilities to and from Italy and Greece" (Routledge) (co-authored with A. Triandafyllidou) and "Integration and Transnationalism in a Comparative Perspective: The Case of Albanian Immigrants in Vienna and Athens" (Austrian Academy of Sciences). Her article "Governing Religious Diversity in the Western Balkans: The Volatility of Ethno-religious Coexistence in Bosnia-Herzegovina and Albania" was published in "Ethnicities".
